New Investigator Spotlight

Nomination Criteria:

- A) The nominee should be a PhD student, trainee (postdoctorate/fellow) or within 7 years of first faculty appointment currently at a facility performing basic, clinical or translational research, or other related research.
- B) The nominee must be an International Society of Hypertension (ISH) member (regardless of category such as Research Fellow, Emerging Leader or Professional member) or have a membership pending before nomination.
- C) The nominee should preferably be an active member of the ISH, or express a desire to become more active in the future.
- D) The nominee must be involved in research related to the field of hypertension- basic, translation or clinical. Ideally, the candidate should also show a history of scholarship activities to support his/her dedication to hypertension research.

Nomination Pathway:

The candidate will either be:

- Identified by the ISH New Investigator Committee (NIC)
- Nominated by other members of ISH
- Self-nominated

Individuals who are nominated by other members of ISH, or wish to self-nominate, should submit a sponsoring letter and copy of their CV to the ISH New Investigator Committee.

This letter should confirm the candidate's eligibility (above, A-C), and briefly comment on the candidate's scholarship. In particular, the sponsor should comment on the nominee's current and future research interests.

For candidates who wish to self-nominate, it is preferred that the candidate identifies an ISH member to sponsor their nomination. However, in absence of an ISH member, the candidate can designate another qualified researcher to write a letter of support.

The ISH NIC will make the final decision for a New Investigator Spotlight invitation.
