# Introduction from the ISH Chair of Communications



The **Hypertension 2021** Joint Scientific Meeting of the International Society of Hypertension, European Society of Hypertension, and British and Irish Hypertension Society has drawn to a close giving us an opportunity to reflect. The numbers are impressive: 127 hours of transmission, almost 1500 presentations and 5380 registrants from 128 countries. Hypertension 2021 therefore represented one of the largest and certainly the most diverse Scientific Meetings that the ISH has hosted. The virtual platform was not without its hiccups, but I believe that the presenters and moderators did a phenomenal job of navigating a virtual landscape that is still new for many of us. With Kyoto 2022 and the 29<sup>th</sup> Scientific Meeting of the International Society of Hypertension now in our sights it will be important to build on this momentum and have a highly successful (hopefully in-person) congress. There were many exciting elements of the Hypertension 2021 program but always notable is the announcement of the ISH Award Winners. As you will see below this



# **Affiliate Events and Activities**

#### Argentine Society of Hypertension

Despite the hard pandemic wave affecting South America on April 22nd-23rd 2021, the XXVII Argentine Society of Hypertension (SAHA) meeting took place virtually, in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, last year's meeting was postponed; however, this year it returned with internationally recognized speakers. The International Society of Hypertension's own Dr. Bryan Williams (ISH secretary) as well as national (Argentinean) leaders in the hypertension field gave lectures and symposia showing the latest advances in hypertension research and clinical treatment. In addition, ISH representatives Dr. Cesar Romero (USA, ISH Regional Advisory Group for Americas) and Dra. Brandi Wynne (USA, ISH New Investigator Committee) attended and co-organised a mini-symposium in collaboration with SAHA for young investigators. On Thursday April 22<sup>nd</sup> the event was attended by young investigators and physicians interested in initiating hypertension research. On Friday 23<sup>th</sup>, an ISH award oral competition was organised between the best four original works presented by young investigators, where Drs Romero, Wynne and Gonzalez (Argentina) were the judges. Dr Romina Di Mattia won the best oral presentation with "The specific inhibition of the cardiac electrogenic sodium/bicarbonate cotransporter leads to cardiac hypertrophy". The runner up was Dr María Florencia Racioppi who presented "Subcellular mechanisms underlying the low cardiotoxicity ofistaroxime". We continued to be impressed at the quality of presentations at SAHA and thank all the presenters and the general public who attended the oral competition. The Argentine hypertension meeting was a great opportunity to reinforce the friendship and collaboration between the ISH and the SAHA.
