It has been a most challenging time to organise a Congress for the local organising committee, alongside the frustrating local Government policy on travel to Japan, which we had hoped would have eased a lot more by now, in line with most of the rest of the world, as we come to live with Covid. The good news is that visa restrictions related to Covid, for entry into Japan, have now been removed from October 11th. I suspect this will have come too late for many of you to start planning to travel to the wonderful city of Kyoto for the Congress. However, do remember that you can still enjoy the meeting via remote access from wherever you are in the world and I would encourage you to register for the meeting to access the many excellent lectures that will be delivered at the congress. Even if the time zone difference means you may not be able to watch the sessions live, they will be available on-demand to watch at a time convenient to you.







For those who are travelling to Japan, I hope you will enjoy an excellent congress in a spectacular setting, and I look forward to meeting many of you face to face, after such a long time. Some of the existing ISH Council members will be completing their term of office and we have recently completed the election process for new members of the ISH Council. Thank you to all those who put themselves forward for election to the Council and all of you who voted in the election.

It is also a time for change of the Presidency of the ISH. I will have the honour of taking over as President of the ISH as the Congress closes. I will present my vision for the ISH over the next two years and announce the new senior officers and leadership structure of the Society after the close

of Congress. That will be my opportunity to thank those who are completing their term of office and are departing from the Council, for all of their work on behalf of the ISH. That will also be the time for me to say a profound thank you and reflect on the impact of the hard work of our current President Maciej Tomaszewski as he leaves the Presidential office.

In the past few weeks, we have also conducted a vote amongst the membership on the new ISH constitution. This was necessary because our existing status is as an unincorporated Charity which exposes the Trustees, i.e. the Council members, to any financial liabilities that the Society may incur. This was an undesirable position and modern Charities have moved to an incorporated status which removes those liabilities. Thus, the change in constitution was driven by the need to update it, to comply with the requirements to apply to the Charity commission for the ISH to become an incorporated Charity. I will say more about that at the General Meeting of the ISH in Kyoto, but please don't let that put you off attending the General Meeting! Let me add that there will be a lot more interesting things than the constitution to discuss at the General Meeting.

Thank you to all who have worked so hard behind the scenes in challenging circumstances to enable the ISH 2022 Congress in Kyoto to take place. Thank you to our members and industry sponsors, for supporting the Congress. Finally, thank you to Hiroshi Itoh, the Chair of the local organising committee and his committee, for their dedication, commitment and months of hard work to create what I hope will be a memorable congress. For those travelling to Kyoto, or joining the Congress on-line, you are assured of the warmest of welcomes.

Two of our ISH Council Members have been recognised for their contributions to hypertension and cardiovascular research and beyond by the American Heart Association (AHA) Council on Hypertension and British and Irish Hypertension Society (BIHS).

Professor Alta Schutte, Immediate Past President, received the 2022 Harriet Dunstan Award by AHA. Professor Bryan Williams, ISH Secretary and ISH President-Elect delivered the 2022 Sir George Pickering Lecture at the September BIHS Annual Meeting.

Professor Schutte has also recently led a metanalysis of randomised controlled trials on the use of RAS inhibitors in people with COVID-19 infections and has shown that RAS inhibitors are safe to continue in patient with COVID infection.
